Many health care organizations often face challenges in operationalizing and sustaining effective community engagement (CE), with many efforts falling short in diversity, feeling tokenistic, or lacking meaningful outcomes.

INSPIRE (Initiating National Strategies for Partnership, Inclusion, and Real Engagement) is a national initiative uniting key organizations and experts with lived experience.
